

Note: There are no Shell or Tesco Garages inside the Peak District national Park, we suggest you fill up before entering the peaks at the closest service station to the event start, we have created a shorter route for this reason.



SNAKE ROAD RUN

The first small run is down a well known driving road in the peaks, Snake Road. From the initial meeting point in Tesco, Glossop, Program in the points in the list below the image into your GPS to get the exact route.



In addition to snake road, we are doing a loop round some smaller villages, the postcodes for this route are as follows.

To get this configured in your gps, add the following destinations to the route plan. Your GPS needs to be able to calculate routes 'via' other locations or you will have to program this route a step at a time. This entire route is covered in detail below.



Section 1 - Glossop to Snake Road

Snake road is a famous UK driving road with tight winding corners, snaking through the heart of the Peaks.

What should be noted about Snake road is that it's single carriageway, not dual. This makes safely overtaking hazardous in parts. Please be aware of this and stay safe. Mobile speed cameras also sometimes operate along this route so we cannot correctly map them for you. Please be on the look out for Police transit vans.



Average Speed for Snake road is 50mph, But please be aware of updated signs along the route.



Tight and Sharp slalom style bends.

Section 2 - Snake Road to Hope

Snake road to Hope covers the A6013 and A6187. The A6013 contains a lot of wide corners with incredible views. It passes along the side of a reservoir and through various villages. Please be careful in the villages, there may be children about. The A6187 is a more residential road with speed limits set to around 30 for this section of the drive. Use your judgement.



Average Speed for this section is Between 30 and 50mph, But please be aware of updated signs along the route.

Section 3 - Hope to Edale

A rally style road with very little in the way of housing after the first mile or so up to Edale. Care should be taken due to the width of the road. This section contains a few small bridges.





Average Speed for this section is Between 30 and National Speed limit, But please be aware of updated signs along the route.

Section 4 - Edgle to Castleton

This is the final section of the course. Time to allow your Turbos to cool and ready yourself for a lovely pub lunch. This section covers small sections of Sheffield Road and Winnats road and includes the section of Edale road after the village.







Average Speed for this section is Between 30 and National Speed limit, But please be aware of updated signs along the route.
